

Dear Scouts, Parents and Family Members:

Thank you for choosing to attend Family Camp #2 (Formerly Dad and Lad) at Camp Lakota. This letter will serve as your leader guide for the camping experience. It is our hope that you Scouts and Families have a fun and memorable experience with our overnight campout.

Section 1: What to Bring for an overnighiter

- Health Form, Parts A&B
- Tent (one can be rented)
- Sleeping Bags / Blankets
- Clothing
- Extra Socks / Undergarments
- Raingear
- Closed-Toe Shoes
 - **NO SANDALS EXCEPT AT THE BEACH**
- Backpack
- Swimgear
- Towel
- Toiletries for Showering
- Flashlight / Lantern
- Water bottle
- Bike (optional), **a helmet is required if you plan to bike**

Section 2: Expected Behaviors at Camp

- 1) All Participants must use the supplied t-shirt and utilizing the supplied wristband. Any person on camp property not wearing the provided shirt, and/or without a wristband will be escorted off of camp property.
- 2) **Camp Lakota is a SMOKE FREE facility.** Any participants found in violation of this policy may be asked to leave camp.
- 3) When riding a bike at camp, please follow all signs for mounting / dismounting. A helmet is required for all participants (adults and youth) that elect to ride a bike.
- 4) Running in camp is prohibited.
- 5) All directives given by camp staff personnel must be followed.
- 6) Families may share tents, but unrelated parties **must** tent separately.
