Since 1910 Scouting has been preparing youth to become tomorrow's leaders. We extended that tradition in 2014 in the Black Swamp Area Council as we continue making today's youth PREPARED FOR LIFE.

Through our 2,118 dedicated volunteers and many generous donors we are able to provide a Scouting program to nearly 5,854 youth. As you review this recap of our past year of service and accomplishments,

- Over 23,000 hours of community service were provided to the communities of Northwest and West Central Ohio.
- 1276 Boy Scouts and 1299 Cub Scouts participated in summer activities throughout our territory.
- 4 Crews made up of 44 total Scouts participated in Philmont Treks.
- 47 youth completed National Youth Leadership training.
- 3,170 youth earned rank advancements.
- Our Learning for Life programs served 437 young people.
- 97 Eagle Scout ranks were earned and 1 National Certificate of Merit was awarded.
- We provided over \$5,000 in direct support in the form of camperships and registration assistance so youth throughout our territory got to experience summer camp and the Scouting program.
- In the fall, we began construction to expand and improve the Donnell Lodge at Camp Berry. The project was under roof at the turn of the year and will be ready before camp opens this summer. The Lodge dining hall will be able to house up to 300 scouters!

In 2014, our new Scout Executive, Marc Kogan, came aboard. We welcome Marc and his family to our communities and embrace their enthusiasm.

The following pages provide much more detail on what the Council has accomplished, and what we will continue to deliver to families and communities of West Central and Northwestern Ohio.

We look forward to thanking each of you in person at one of our upcoming events. We hope you will join us in helping Scouting grow and prosper for the next generation of leaders! Your support makes the difference for the youth that we serve!



CATHERINE CRAFT – Arrowwood District

For the last 13 years, Cathy Craft has dedicated much of her free time to supporting Scouting in various ways. Cathy was Pack and Troop 449's Unit Commissioner from 2001-2012. During this time, she also served as a Committee Member for 4 years, a Webelos Den Leader for 2 years and a Crew Advisor for 1 year. Additionally, Cathy was the Buckeye Day Camp Director for 4 years; from 2005-2008.

Cathy works as a library aid for Mohawk Schools and is the lead cook at Camp Lakota in the summers. Her family is also very involved in Scouting. Cathy's husband Tod is the Arrowwood District Commissioner, her son Ethan was a dedicated Scout and her daughter Tabitha earned the Silver Award, the highest honor in Venturing. So, there is no surprise that they earned the Scout Family of the Year award in 2006.

From 2011-2013, Cathy held the position of NYLT Course Director but her involvement began far before that, dating back to 2006. She is a Vigil Honor recipient of the Order of the Arrow in 2012 and earned the District Award of Merit in 2006. Cathy has also been active in the University of Scouting, as staff in 2006, 2009, and 2014 and she is the Order of the Arrow chapter advisor dating back to 2014.



DAVE SIELSCHOTT- Arrowwood District

Dave is currently registered with Troop 318 and is Arrowwood District's Advancement Co-Chair. He has spent most of his life dedicating time to Scouts. He started his Scouting career with Pack 82 in Lima in 1964. He followed the path from Cub Scout to Boy Scout and joined the Order of the Arrow with Troop 82 in 1970.

Dave began his involvement in adult leadership as an Assistant Scoutmaster in Troop 310 in Findlay from 1979 until 1983. During his career with Marathon Petroleum, Dave was transferred to Greenwood, IN. While in Greenwood, his son Adam joined Pack 621. Dave then served as Den Leader from 1991-1994. After Adam crossed over in 1994, Dave attended summer camp with the Troop. Soon after, he took a position in the Findlay office of Marathon and he and his wife and kids moved to Arlington.

BRAD SLAGLEY – Arrowwood District

Brad Slagley's active involvement in Scouting spans over 25 years. He became involved in Scouting when he was both a Cub and Boy Scout and his Scouting passion was reignited when his son joined Cub Scouts in 1992 in Illinois. Following a move to Findlay, he and his son, Kyle, joined Pack 309. When his son crossed over into Troop 308 in the following year, Brad found himself holding the positions of Assistant Scoutmaster. Troop Committee member, Committee Chair, and Advancement chair during that time. About the time his son Kyle was earning his Eagle, Brad's younger son, Colton, became a Tiger and so Brad rejoined Pack 309. He then also held the positions of Pack Committee Member and Unit Commissioner between 2006 and 2010.

During Brad's years of dedicated Scouting, he has also acquired a very admirable camping history.

joined Troop 318 and Dave became the Assistant Scoutmaster. His younger son, Jon followed them to their Troop in 1997 after he crossed over. Dave continued his role of Assistant Scoutmaster until 2008 when he became Scoutmaster, which he kept until 2012. After leaving his Scoutmaster role, he became a Troop Advancement chair and District Advancement Co-chair, where he remains today.

Dave also has a very notable camping history. He has led his Troop to Camp Berry every year since 1995 when he returned to the area. That marks 20 years of Camp Berry camping history! Dave also has had the unique opportunity to host a French Scout. Helie De Saint Laurent joined Troop 318 for both summer camp in 2013 and a high adventure trip in 2014. Also, Dave has been able to attend a high adventure camp every other year!

Brad has attended Dad and Lad four years, Cub Resident Camp two years and Boy Scout Resident Camp two years. He has also taken high adventure trips to Philmont in both 2001 and 2004 and he lead the first district wide sailing trip in the Florida Keys in 2006.

There are also several other aspects of Scouting that Brad is active in. The University of Scouting is something that is also very important to Brad, having served as both a Committee Member and Chairman. After completing his first Woodbadge ticket, he has since returned as a Woodbadge course instructor. Additionally, in 2014, he was a participant in the 21st Century Woodbadge course. He has been a very active member in the annual Friends of Scouting campaign for over 10 years as well.

TAMMY SPEER – Hawthorn District

Tammy Speer has been a very important part of Scouting not only in the Hawthorn District, where she is the Training Chair, but also in camping across the Council. Tammy has held many roles in various capacities. She is very involved in Cub Scout camping as the Director of Dad & Lad since 2011. Tammy has also been at both Cub Resident Camp and Day Camp in various roles including Assistant Program Director, Program Director and Camp Director. She doesn't lose her camp spirit for the Boy Scouts though, as Tammy has been an integral part of the Camp Lakota Staff since 2010. Tammy earned her Woodbadge beads in 2009 and has been on Woodbadge staff in 2012, 2014 and 2015.

Her role as training chair doesn't come without merit. Tammy has led or been a part of Cub Specific Training, BALOO, Scoutmaster Specific Training, IOLS and various other trainings, both at District and Council levels. Tammy has both participated in and been on staff for the University of Scouting since 2007 and she attended National Camp School in both 2009 and 2014.

SANDY WOOD – Chinquapin District

Sandy Wood is a long time Scouter with a history dating back over 20 years. She began her Scouting tenure when her son decided to join. Sandy took a leading role in many different cub camping experiences. Starting in 1996, Sandy served several years on Dad and Lad staff and also Mom and Me where she co-chaired this event a few times. In addition, she was on staff as the health officer for National Camp School as well as at our own Camps, Lakota and Berry.

Around this same time period, Sandy was awarded the Commissioner Award, the Chairman's Award, the Arrowhead Honor Award, the District Award of Merit, and she was honored with the Distinguished Scouter Award. She was the Cub Day Camp Director for 4 years after serving on staff for 1 year. She earned her Woodbadge beads in 1998 and then returned as Medical Officer and Quartermaster. She also earned a second Distinguished Scouter Award while she was the Post Advisor with Explorer In addition to all of her camp contributions, Tammy has had other significant influences in the Scouting world. She was the Den Leader and Cubmaster with Pack 227 between 2006 and 2010, where she earned the Cub Scout Den Leader Award, Cubmaster Training Award and was named Hawthorn Cubmaster of the Year. She also led Pack 35 from 2011 through 2014. Also, Tammy has earned the District Award of Merit, the Scouter's Key and the WD Boyce Award.

When Tammy isn't with her Scouting family, she is the Patient Care Coordinator at the Family Eye Care Clinic of Bluffton. She also is active at church with the Alter-Rosary Society and belongs to the VFW Women's Auxiliary of Columbus Grove. She lives in Columbus Grove with her husband, Doug who is also involved in various facets of Scouting and two Scout sons, Jon and Buckey. 2014 Philmont




